Due to the overwhelming growth and demand for quality care of animals, Dr. Lewis has decided that they needed to expand with more exam rooms, a centralized pharmacy, and a special compassion/tranquility room for those clients that must make difficult decisions regarding their family member. These are just a few of the changes being made. An open house will be announced at a future date to show the public a “new” but ever remaining, state of the art Veterinarian Clinic.

Lewis Veterinary Clinic, PC prides itself on its success not only with the loyalty of our clients and new referrals, but also with our staff knowledge and overwhelming

desire to keep your family pets healthy for a very long time. We offer 24 emergency care, with a Dr. on call, outside of our hours listed. We treat all domestic animals, other than exotic and avian. If you have a sick goat, sheep, or small barn animal, we treat those as well.

Lewis Veterinary Clinic, PC is associated with many organizations that promote animal care and wellbeing. They are partners with the Lycoming County SPCA in the Low Income Voucher program, along with spaying or neutering a pet for them for no charge monthly. They celebrate National Spay Day annually by providing spay/neuter services for Lycoming and Clinton county residents which they donate monies toward. They are members of the National APSCA. They are the only local partner with the Meow House, in Cogan Station, PA, (570) 494-1550 that provides families that adopt from their organization, a lower cost on spays and or neuters, and many more. Lewis Veterinary Clinic, PC has state of the art technology to better serve their clients. They have upgraded to digital radiography a few years ago. They have an ultra sound machine for increased diagnostic capabilities, a Tono-Vet Pet Glaucoma instrument, an in house laboratory, ultra sonic teeth cleaning machine for dental work, and so much more. They carry Prescription Diet pet foods and all kinds of products to ensure the best animal care. Their waiting room is like no other in the area as well. It is very spacious so animals don't argue, it has a beautiful pond with fish and turtles, and educational area, a play station for the kids, and a large screen TV for those who want to be educated while they wait.

On May 14, 2007, it was our incredible honor to hire Dr. Rachel Teribury, D.V.M. to our staff. She came with vast knowledge in just not small companion animals, but large as well.
